RECYCLING IN COLLEGE HILL

College Hill Recycling Drives — December 11, 2021 and in 2022: March 26, July 9, September 17, December 10. Save these dates!

Please have your aluminum, steel, copper, brass, bronze, and other metals on or at the base of your front porch (readily viewable from the street) by 9 a.m.

Recycling has brought in over \$14,000 over the years! Your support of this effort is greatly appreciated. Please don't give your recyclables to the landfill — or to the county! Save them for College Hill!

We would appreciate your cooperation with new recycling protocols. We need neighbors to **save and sort** their metals (especially aluminum beverage cans).

- Aluminum beverage cans together.
- Steel cans, cat food and tuna fish cans, aluminum foil and pie pans together.
- Other metals (aluminum sheeting/storm doors, copper pipes/fittings, bronze) separate.
- We *will not* be able to take large steel appliances (e.g., water heaters, washing machines)
- We *will not* be accept random steel items, such as blinds, clothes hangers, nuts/bolts.

LIGHT UP THE NEIGHBORHOOD

KEEP YOUR PORCH LIGHT ON!

The College Hill Neighborhood Association is happy to announce that we have been awarded a \$4,500 grant from the Topeka Community Foundation. The grant helped purchase LED light bulbs with photocells. The photocell will detect when the sun is out and turn off in the morning. Similarly, it will turn on at night. With everyone's busy schedules, this will help us maintain a well lit block throughout College Hill at a minimum cost of electricity, around \$5.00 a year. Just \$5 a year will light our porches for 12 hours overnight. What a simple yet effective way to keep our neighborhood safe!

The light bulbs have arrived! This fall volunteers will be walking throughout the neighborhood to deliver and help install the bulbs.

We challenge you to light up College Hill! Get your neighbors involved, make it a block challenge. Studies suggest that concerted efforts to light neighborhoods lead to safer outcomes — more light, safer neighborhood. Not to mention you can check out all the beautiful yards, gardens and flowers our neighbors continue to have season after season.

FREE WIFI IN BOSWELL PARK

College Hill was awarded a grant from the Kansas Leadership Center, in partnership with the College Hill Neighborhood Association, Westminster Presbyterian Church, and Ad Astra Fiber to supply free Wifi to Boswell Park, just south of the church, across the street in the parking lot. This partnership will help area students, children and adults to have access to Wifi — who might not otherwise have access. With virtual school still an option for families, this will help students succeed academically.
