Topeka, KS (Feb. 10, 2022) - With some of the coldest temperatures experienced so far this winter season hitting the Topeka area, The Salvation Army has its doors open as a warming center and every day for the rest of the winter if temperatures dip to 20 degrees or below.

The Salvation Army at 1320 SE 6th Street will open as a warming center from 10 am to 4 pm on weekdays and from 10 am to 1 pm on Sundays.

Every person utilizing the warming center will receive a bag containing water, light snacks, and cold weather safety information.

“We know people need a warm place to stay in during the day with these extremely cold temperatures, and we wanted to take steps to provide those locations while also maintaining as much of a safe space as possible,” said Capt. Cristian Lopez
