WHAT KINDS OF ANIMALS NEED FOSTER FAMILIES?



Examples of pets needing foster care: pregnant animals, baby animals not yet big enough to be up for adoption, fospice (end of life care), weight gain, needing socialization, minor injuries, heartworm treatment, minor behavior work, awaiting transfer to rescue, etc.
