



REAR-FACING CAR SEAT:

- Children under one year of age (ALWAYS)
- Back seat of the vehicle
- Remain rear-facing for as long as possible
- Remain rear-facing until they reach the maximum height OR weight limit



FORWARD-FACING CAR SEAT:

- Back seat of the vehicle
- Must have a harness and tether
- Remain forward-facing until they reach the maximum height OR weight limit



BOOSTER SEAT:

- Back seat of the vehicle
- Seat belt fits properly over the strongest parts of the body
- Remain in a booster seat until they are big enough to fit into a seat belt properly



SEAT BELT:

- For a seat belt to fit properly, the lap belt must lie snug across the upper thighs (not the stomach) and the shoulder belt should lie snug across the shoulder and chest (not across the neck or face)

CAR SEAT SAFETY

Kansas law requires the use of a car seat or booster seat until your child is at least 8 years old OR 4'9" tall OR weighs 80 pounds

Children should ride in the back seat until 13 years of age because it is best for children to ride as far away from the airbags as possible
